## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS OVERVIEW

- Course Minimum: The history major requires a minimum of 12 unique courses.
- Upper Division Requirement: At least eight of the 12 courses must be upper division (HIS 100-199), including the exit/DC requirement.
- Lower Division Course Restriction: A maximum of four courses may be lower division (HIS 1-99), including the survey course.
- ☐ The Exit/Disciplinary Communication (DC)
  ☐ General Education Requirements are satisfied by completing an exit seminar (one quarter: 190 series, 194 series, or 196 series) in your chosen region of concentration.
- Transfer Courses: Up to three lower division history courses completed at a California Community College may be applied to your major requirements, with no more than two courses applied to a single region of concentration. Courses completed at other colleges or universities may also apply; consult with the History Undergraduate Program Coordinator.
- Study Abroad: A maximum of three courses completed via the UC Education Abroad Program may be applied to the history major requirements.
- Interdisciplinary Coursework: You may petition to apply one course taken from another UCSC department of study (e.g., sociology, literature, politics) to your upper-division elective requirement. Interdisciplinary courses may not satisfy chronological distribution requirements.
- A minimum of six regularly scheduled history courses including the exit/DC requirement must be taken from members of the UCSC History Department faculty.
